Dredging update – Aaron Lowin

Two dredge contractors should be doing site visits at Lagoon Point in December to look over our central basin and inlet channel and advise us on how their firms might go about bringing in equipment, dredging the basin, and disposing of the dredge 'spoils' – perhaps 20-24,000 cubic yards. For our permit applications we need to specify how we would do the dredging and how we would dispose of spoils. The Lagoon Point site poses very difficult challenges for dredging because our inlet channel is narrow and shallow. This access problem and the lack of a local site to hold the spoils mean that the cost of dredging will likely be very high, no matter how the work is done.
