INTERESTING QUOTE

The following snippet was taken from a "Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Decision" letter to the company that will be replacing a few pilings in LP. It's from the Island County Hearing Examiner, regarding LP canals.

"This area was designated for medium to high density shoreline residential development prior to the SMA [shoreline management act]. The manmade canal community was created with the intention of utilizing the canals for boating structures appurtenant to the residences.

The manmade canal is not designated as a Marine Fish and Wildlife Habitat Conservation area.

This canal community was designed for boating purposes related to single-family residences. As such, the proposal to install replacement and new pilings associated with future proposed docks, or future proposed expansions of existing docks, is consistent with the area's intended use and, if applicant adheres to the conditions of this permit, no adverse impact to existing natural systems is anticipated."

This is a quote we should remember when we approach dredging applications, water uses or maintenance projects.
